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


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From Principal's Desk

1. Blood Donation Camp & Health Mela, 2019



BVCOE NSS organised a free Health Checkup Mela and Blood Donation/Donar Camp for faculty, staff and students of Bharati Vidyapeeth's Campus on January 15 and 16, 2019 respectively. The mela was organised in association with Pushpanjali Hospital & Trauma Centre and Rotary Club, New Delhi. It was organised to mark the auspicious occasion of birthdays of our Honourable Founder Dr. Patangrao Kadam and Honourable Secretary Dr. Vishwajeet Kadam. The team members of the club including one Physician, Two Dentists, one Gynaecologist and Nurses arrived at the college at 11:00am. The Principal and the head doctor lighted up the lamp and addressed the gathering. Free physical examinations along with free Blood tests, Blood pressure, ECG, Lungs test and dental checkup were provided.







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Approximately 200 faculty members, staff members and students from all branches and institutes of Bharati Vidyapeeth came for health checkup and blood donation. Many blood donors were also registered for future blood requirement. Free consultation was provided by the doctors. Camp was successfully organized under the guidance of Dr. Anil Kumar, Programme officer- BVCOE NSS.

5. Poshan Abhiyan.





Poshan Abhiyan is an initiative by the students volunteers of NSS unit, BVCOE to defeat the plethora of diseases caused due to malnutrition. On 13 September, 2019, volunteers organised various rallies and campaigns for awareness against such diseases, such as defeat diarrhoea campaigns, cyclerallies, nukkad nataks, etc. Event was held in the area of Paschim Vihar.









Key features and objectives of the Poshan Abhiyaan include:

Prevention of Malnutrition: The program aims to reduce instances of stunting, under-nutrition, and low birth weight in children, as well as anemia, low BMI, and malnutrition among women.

Convergence: It focuses on the convergence of various ministries and departments related to health, education, water and sanitation, social welfare, and women and child development to ensure a holistic approach to nutrition.

Behavioral Change: Poshan Abhiyaan emphasizes behavioral change communication (BCC) to create awareness about nutrition and encourage healthier practices related to breastfeeding, complementary feeding, and dietary diversity.

Use of Technology: The initiative leverages technology for real-time monitoring and tracking the progress of various interventions. It employs mobile applications to track nutrition-related data and performance indicators.

Jan Andolan (People's Movement): It seeks to mobilize communities and create a people's movement to eradicate malnutrition by involving local communities and stakeholders.

Targeted Approach: Poshan Abhiyaan identifies specific target groups such as pregnant women, lactating mothers, and children under the age of 6 years to provide them with adequate nutrition and healthcare services.

Capacity Building: The program aims to build the capacity of frontline workers, such as Anganwadi workers and ASHA (Accredited Social Health Activist) workers, by providing them with training and resources to deliver nutrition-related services effectively.



6. Youth Parliament Organised by BVCOENSS with UTHAN.

Youth Parliament with Uthan was a 2-day event organised by the NSS unit of On the 2nd and 3rd of November, 2019. Students from various schools and institutions in Delhi-NCR participated in the event, representing houses of the Indian Parliament, Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha. Afterwards Best Speaker Delegate, and Best Delegate team were chosen and awarded.

Report of the NSS National Webinar

A NSS National webinar was jointly organized by NSS Cell of GGSIP university (Unit-G) & Bharati Vidyapeeth's College of Engineering (BVCOE), New Delhi (affiliated colleges run under GGSIPU) on 17th June, 2020 with the theme "Water Conservation, Waste Management and Sanitation". The webinar was spread over three sessions namely Water Conservation (10:30 am to 11:30 am), Sanitation (1:00 pm to 2:00 pm) and Waste Management (4:00 pm to 5:00 pm). It was convened by Dr. Anil Kumar (Program Officer, NSS, Bharati Vidyapeeth's College of Engineering , New Delhi) and Dr. Shivani Goswami (Program Officer, Unit-G, NSS, GGSIPU) and panellists were Prof (Dr) Mahesh Verma (Vice Chancellor, GGSIPU), Prof (Dr) Dharmender Saini (Principal, Bharati Vidyapeeth's College of Engineering, New Delhi), Prof(Dr) Vivek Kumar(Centre for Rural Development and Technology, IIT, Delhi), Prof(Dr) BVR Reddy (Program Coordinator, NSS, GGSIPU), Dr. Sushmita Mohapatra (Dean-Admissions and Student Welfare, Bharati Vidyapeeth's College of Engineering, New Delhi). Several students and NSS Volunteers from different colleges across the country attended the webinar. Prof (Dr) Dharmendra Saini (Principal, Bharati Vidyapeeth's College of Engineering, New Delhi) enlightened everyone with his inaugural speech and welcomed all the panellists and attendees. He also mentioned the importance of the topic and its need of the hour. Also, Prof (Dr) BVR Reddy (Program Coordinator, NSS, GGSIPU) enlightened us with his words of wisdom on the need of this topic in current prevailing Pandemic situation. Prof (Dr) Mahesh Verma (Vice Chancellor, GGSIPU) also enlightened everyone with his words of wisdom. The brief of Webinar is summarised below: -

Panellist I: Prof (Dr) Vivek Kumar (Centre for Rural Development and Technology, IIT, Delhi)

He elucidated everyone with his views on Water Sustainability. He gave an insight into water stress and water scarcity and current prevailing scenario. He also briefed about why water sustainability is required in India and what is water budgeting. His humble words made us understand why water sustainability is the need of the hour and how we as citizens can give our contribution.



Panellist II: Prof (Dr) BVR Reddy (Program Coordinator, NSS, GGSIPU)

He enlightened everyone with his opinion on Sanitation and its need. He reciprocated what is sanitation, its advantages, types, how it can be improved etc. He also incited everyone on how to maintain Environmental Sanitation. 

16. National Conclave on Mann Ki Baat@100


