* Group 2 were given a task to visit Gaushala in Ashram, spending time with the cows allowed volunteers to observe and understand their behaviour, communication cues, and social interactions. Volunteers learned practical skills related to the care and management of cows, such as feeding, watering, grooming, and handling. They gained knowledge about the nutritional needs of cows, proper feeding schedules, and how to recognize signs of illness or distress.
